THE RESTORE PROJECT, PAPUA NEW GUINEA

The focus of Restore is in the Papua New Guinea east coast province of Milne Bay where they partner with the Anglican, United (Methodist) and Kwato (Congregational) churches. Through a large network of mission stations, they care for the spiritual, medical and educational needs of some of the poorest people in PNG.

With help from HART, Restore has been working on the refurbishment of the medical resupply ship, the Endurance. Once completed, the Endurance will operate in the Milne Bay province, supplying medication to 29 remote mission health stations, transporting patients and passengers, and delivering goods to community stores, which often serve as the primary source of income for residents.

WHO WE ARE & WHAT WE DO

HART was founded in 2004 by Baroness Caroline Cox, a Life Peer of the UK House of Lords, with a mission to address the suffering and persecution of those neglected by aid organizations and the media.

HART Australasia, established in 2010, collaborates with HART UK to support communities in conflict zones, post-conflict areas, and regions where people face marginalization and oppression. By relying on first-hand evidence of human rights violations,

HART implements a twin-track strategy focused on international advocacy and targeted aid work, emphasizing sustainable community development. The organization prioritizes local involvement in aid management to ensure that support preserves dignity, aligns with community needs, and positively impacts the local economy.



KYAMPISI CHILDCARE MINISTRIES, UGANDA

KCM was founded in 2009 by Pastor Peter Sewakiryanga in Kyampisi, a small village, east of Kampala. The organization emerged from the recognition that children's potential was overshadowed by poverty, lack of education and healthcare, broken families, and witchcraft. Peter and his team observed numerous instances of child abuse and witchcraft-driven human rights violations, including kidnappings and disappearances.

Motivated by faith in Jesus Christ, KCM aims to combat poverty, empower families through education, seek justice through advocacy, and provide support to vulnerable children. Recently, HART facilitated transport for children to access medical and rehabilitation services.

LOI TAI LENG SCHOOL, THAILAND

Our partner, HART UK, built a dam in a nearby valley to provide water for agricultural development and strengthen regional food security. It also has the potential to generate hydroelectric power for the school, especially during rainy seasons when solar panels are less effective.

During the COVID-19 peak in 2021, border closures nearly doubled food transportation costs, raising concerns about meal provisions. Thanks to HART's support, the school maintained three nutritious meals daily for 340 boarding students throughout the year.
